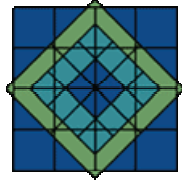

- 1982 Prior to CHAPT's founding, APT activities in the Chicago area are coordinated through the APT Midwest Region whose officers include future CHAPT members Hal Edwards, Regional Vice President; Binnie Ferrand, Secretary; Frankett Kral, Treasurer; and, Art and Laurel Nelson, Chapter Coordinators. - 1983 With the urging of APT Midwest Region VP, Hal Edwards, Rog O'Brien organizes and founds CHAPT which holds its first meeting, with approximately 20 people, in Glenview in December. - 1985 Without the benefit of a full-time professional staff, APT asks CHAPT to accept the challenge of hosting the APT VI International Conference, "Exploring Our Differences;" on the Northwestern University campus in June. Among the many CHAPT volunteers for this event were: Hal Edwards, Conference Chair; Frankett Kral, Financial Chair; Joann Aggens, Program Chair; Binnie Ferrand, Site Chair; Barbara Olson, Registrations Chair; and, Rog O'Brien, Transportation and Parking. First chapter By-Laws are drafted and approved. CHAPT is recognized with APT's highest chapter award, the Chapter Growth & Development Award, at APT International Conference XIII in Scottsdale, Arizona, in July.
